The mission of the Long Beach Housing Authority is to provide high quality housing assistance for Long Beach's low -income house holds through:

- Effectivelyandefficientlyutilizingresources.
- Promotingapositiveimagethroughexcellentcustomerserviceandclearandopen communication.
- Continuallyeducatingstaffandclients.

WithinthescopeoftheHousingAuthority'smission, specific goals have been established:

- TheHousingAuthoritywillcontinuetoapplyforadditionalvoucherswhenevertheopportunity ispresented.
- TheHousingAuthoritywillcontinuetoimprovemanagementtoprovidebetterservicetoits customers.
- TheHousingAuthoritywillcontinuetoreachouttoadditionalpropertyowners.

There is a great need for housing assistance in Long Beach. As of the 2000 census, 25, 479 households were at 30 percentor less of median in come, and another 20,000 were at 50 percentor less of median in come. Median in come for the Los Angeles -Long Beach metropolitan statistical area is currently at \$50,300.00 for a family of four; 30 percent of median is \$16,900. Atypical rent for atwo -bedroom a partment in the central part of Long Beach is \$731.00. If a family of four has an income at 30 percent of median, the family coul dnot payrent and pay for other necessities as well. Additionally, while the median income for LA -Long Beach is \$50,300, in Long Beach alone the median income for a family of four is only \$37,270, which demonstrates the need for assistance in our city.

TheHousingAuthority'swaitinglistwasopenedin1997, and still contains families. The waiting list is open as of this writing, and will be closed on May 31, 2003. The waiting list will be opened again on August 1, 2003, and will remain open.

- Maximizing the number of affordable units available by establishing payments tandards that will enable families to rentinas broad a market area as possible.

- Withinmeansavailable, provide counseling to the extremely low -income applicants who have a difficult time finding affordable housing, even with their voucher.
- MaketheprojectbasingofSect ion8vouchersanoptioninallareasoftheCityasopportunity arises.
