## **9. REAC Follow Up Plan**

A review of the Survey Section Results by year indicates several fluctuations in the Authority's scoring.

### **Maintenance and Repair**

The survey results reveal a 1.9% drop in the survey score between FY 2002 and 2003. Based upon the results by question improvements are needed in response time to emergency repairs. The Authority recently implemented a new communication system which provides the residents with direct contact with the maintenance staff for reporting emergencies. Training for maintenance personnel is now being provided to improve the quality of work. Staff members are being focus on treating the residents with dignity and respect and to develop a consumer / client based delivery system of services.

### **Communication**

The survey results reveal a 4.8% increase in the survey score between FY 2002 and 2003. The Authority will continue to provide residents with additional information on all maintenance and repair matters. Staff will become more responsive to resident's questions and concerns; will be more courteous and professional when dealing with " residents and the tenant associations. Additional services and programs are being developed for residents.

### **Safety**

The survey results reveal a 10.8% increase in the survey score between FY 2002 and 2003. Security contracts are continuing. Additional surveillance cameras have been installed at the Fogarty building. New entry locks and keys have been installed.

### **Services**

The survey results reveal a 4.7% drop in the survey score between FY 2002 and 2003. Additional services and programs are being developed for residents. The Newburgh Enlarge School will be providing several programs at the Mullins Center this year, including parenting liaison and English as a Second Language classes.

### **Neighborhood Appearance**

The survey results reveal a 3.4% increase in the survey score between FY 2002 and 2003. Exterior repair to the building will be included in the Capital Plan: The Authority I recently installed a new parking lot. Our Capital Fund Projects this year will install a new section of sidewalk and storm doors, which will greatly improve the neighborhood appearance. On going maintenance is addressing lingering repairs and work orders for neighborhood appearance. Maintenance will be directed to improve the upkeep and curb appeal of the parking areas,

playground and basketball court. The Authority will continue to aggressively remove abandoned cars and repair broken windows and eliminate graffiti. The authority recently increased pest control services at the Fogarty building.
