Statement of Progress Relating to the Five-Year Plan

Goal 1: Expand the supply of assisted housing

The modernization of GA085-2 is now complete and the Authority has begun re-renting those units. The Authority will also continue investigating alternatives for development or expansion utilizing both HUD and non-HUD programs.

Goal 2: Improve the quality of assisted housing

The Authority is in the process of developing plans that will result in a significant increase in the quality and rentability of the existing housing stock. The Authority has solicited professional services to develop a master plan for GA085-3 (A) which will include modernization of dwelling units and the demolition of fifteen (15) two-story units.

Goal 3: Increase assisted housing choices

The Authority has not implemented any homeownership programs at this time but will continue to investigate opportunities to implement a homeownership program. The Authority will continue to look for funding sources and partners to provide alternatives to traditional public housing.

Goal 4: Improve community quality of life and economic vitality

The Authority has partnered with Family Connection to provide a program for both youth and adults. The Authority was able to help provide funds for the program from funds left from a previous grant. The QHA will continue to look for alternative funding sources.

Goal 5: Promote self-sufficiency and asset development of families and individuals

The Authority contracted with a consulting firm to provide training to the Resident Advisory Board. The training taught the members of the Board the basics of public housing operations, rules and regulations and how to provide positive input into every day operations. The RAB also helps the Authority identify initiatives for the utilization of Resident Participation Funding. The resident advisory board continues to meet on a quarterly basis and provide feedback to the Authority.

Goal 6: Ensure Equal Opportunity in Housing for all Americans

The Authority follows its Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy to the letter and does not discriminate against anyone.

Attachment F

Resident Assessment and Satisfaction Survey

Due to the deregulation of small housing authorities, the Quitman Housing Authority is assessed every other year under the RASS program. However, due to contract dispute, resident surveys were not sent out this year; therefore, the prior year's scores were pushed up so a final PHAS score could be issued. We have included our response to the most recent RASS survey.

Based on the results of the RASS survey, the Quitman Housing Authority was deficient in the area(s) of Communication (71.5%), Safety (71.8%), and Neighborhood Appearance (65.4%). The Authority expects this follow-up plan to address all factors of the recent survey.

- With regards to communication, the Authority issues a newsletter quarterly to promote communication with the resident population. The Authority will enhance the newsletter to include more information on the role of the Authority and other local providers. The Authority will also request that the City provide notice to residents in the event of utility interruption and will attempt to make alternative arrangements, if possible. As part of the Resident Advisory Board training, the Authority will sponsor functions that will promote overall resident involvement in the RAB activities.
- Communication during leasing will be enhanced through a reading of the lease documents with reinforcement through periodic follow-up meetings. In addition, a routine 30-day follow-up briefing will be instituted to promote resident awareness of rules and regulations as well as to inform residents of the activities of the agency.
- Safety has been greatly enhanced through the installation of a security camera system in developments as they are modernized. Within the next year, the West Hill and Southridge Crossing developments will be equipped and the system at Highland Circle will be upgraded.
- As modernization funds permit, lighting at all developments will also be enhanced and additional fencing will be installed. The Authority is diligently working on filling all vacant units to promote safety as well.
- The staff, in consultation with the Resident Advisory Board and neighborhood representatives, will draft and promote neighborhood improvement plans for each remaining unmodernized development, thereby establishing the role of residents in achieving maximum neighborhood appeal. The Executive Director and the housing management staff will develop methods of enforcing model neighbor standards, marketing strategies and a marketing plan for future success. This will include identifying federal sources of funding for physical improvements to the housing stock. The Capital Fund Program Five-Year Plan included in the Agency Plan includes initiatives to improve the appearance of neighborhoods and this, coupled with improvements made since the survey, should result in a vast improvement of this score.

HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF QUITMAN

VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE POLICY

I. Background

The Violence Against Women and the Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005 (VAWA) prohibits the eviction of, and removal of assistance from, certain persons living in public or Section 8 assisted housing if the grounds for eviction or removal of assistance is an instance of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking. This policy is intended as a guide for the Housing Authority to use in day-to-day operations when working with tenants who are victims of domestic violence.

II. Admissions

The Housing Authority shall not deny admission to any applicant on basis that the applicant is or has been a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking if the applicant otherwise qualifies for assistance or admission.

III. Termination

An incident or incidents of actual or threatened domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking will not be construed as a serious or repeated violation of a lease by the victim or threatened victim of that violence and will not be good cause for terminating the tenancy or occupancy rights of the victim of such violence.

Although screening and eviction policies allow the Housing Authority to evict households for criminal activity by a member of the family or a guest that threatens the health, safety, or right to peaceful enjoyment of other residents, the Housing Authority may exercise discretionary authority to remove tenants involved in perpetrating acts of domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking from the household while allowing the victim of such acts to remain in the unit.

The Housing Authority will, when notified, honor court orders addressing rights of access to or control of the property, including civil protection orders issued to protect the victim and issued to address the distribution of possession of property among the household members in cases where a family breaks up. Furthermore, the Housing Authority may still evict a Tenant for any violation of the lease not premised on the act or acts of violence in question against a Tenant or a member of the Tenant's household, provided that the Housing Authority does not subject an individual who is or has been a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking to a more demanding standard than other tenants in determining whether to evict or terminate.

HA Code: GA085

The Housing Authority may terminate the tenancy of any Tenant if an actual and eminent threat to other tenants or those employed at or providing service to the property if that Tenant's tenancy is not terminated can be demonstrated.

This Policy does not supersede any provision of any federal, state, or local law that provides greater protection than this section for victims of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking.

IV. Certification

The Housing Authority may request that an individual claiming protection under VAWA certify via an approved certification form that such individual is a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, and that the incident or incidents in question are bona fide incidents of such actual or threatened abuse and meet the requirements set forth in the aforementioned paragraphs. The certification shall include the name of the perpetrator. The individual shall provide such certification within fourteen (14) business days after the Housing Authority requests such certification.

If the individual does not provide the certification within fourteen (14) business days after the Housing Authority has requested such certification in writing, the Housing Authority may evict any tenant or lawful occupant that commits violations of the lease. The Housing Authority may extend the fourteen (14) day deadline at its discretion.

The certification requirement may be satisfied by providing the Housing Authority with documentation signed by an employee, agent, or volunteer of a victim service provider, an attorney, or a medical professional, from whom the victim has sought assistance in addressing domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking or the effects of the abuse, in which the professional attests under penalty of perjury (28 U.S.C. §1746) to the professional's belief that the incident or incidents in question are bona fide incidents of abuse, and the victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking has signed or attested to the documentation; or by producing a Federal, State, tribal, territorial, or local police or court record.

The Housing Authority reserves the right to demand that an individual produce official documentation or physical proof of the individual status as a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking in order to receive any of the benefits under VAWA. At the Housing Authority's discretion, it may provide for benefits to an individual based solely on the individual statement or other collaborating evidence.

V. Confidentiality

All information provided to the Housing Authority pursuant to VAWA, including the fact that an individual is a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking, will be retained in confidence and shall neither be entered into any shared database nor provided to any related entity, except to the extent that disclosure is requested or consented to by the individual in writing or required for use in an eviction proceeding or otherwise required by applicable law.

HA Code: GA085

VI <u>Definitions</u>

For purposes of this policy, the following definitions apply:

<u>Dating Violence</u>: Violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; and where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors: the length of the relationship, the type of relationship, and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship.

<u>Domestic Violence</u>: Felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed by a current or former spouse of the victim, by a person with whom the victim shares a child in common, by a person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse, by a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or by any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction.

<u>Stalking:</u> To follow, pursue or repeatedly commit acts with the intent to kill, injure, harass, or intimidate; or to place under surveillance with the intent to kill, injure, harass, or intimidate another person; and in the course of, or as a result of, such following, pursuit, surveillance, or repeatedly committed acts, to place a person in reasonable fear of the death of, or serious bodily injury to, or to cause substantial emotional harm to that person, a member of the immediate family of that person, or the spouse or intimate partner of that person. The term "immediate family member" means, with respect to a person--

- (A) a spouse, (brother or sister, or child) of that person, or an individual to whom that person stands in loco parentis; or
- (B) any other person living in the household of that person and related to that person by blood or marriage.
