Violence Against Women Policy

Resolution 2007/15

On this 7th day of February, 2007, Motion by Sova Supported by Morrow to adopt Resolution 2007/15, Violence Against Women Policy.

As required by the provisions of Sections 606 and 607 of the Violence Against Women, Justice Department Reauthorization Act of 2005 (VAWA), Public Law 109-162 and PIH Notice 2006-42.

- "Violence Against Women Act" is an act defining violence against women and their children, providing for protective measures for victims, prescribing penalties therefore, and for others purposes.
- "Violence against women and their children" refers to any act or a series of acts committed by any person against a woman who is his wife, former wife, or against a woman with whom the person has or had a sexual or dating relationship. Or with whom he has a common child, or against her whether legitimate or illegitimate, within or without the family abode, which result ion or is likely to result in physical, sexual, psychological harm or suffering, or economic abuse including threats of such acts, battery, assault, coercion, harassment or arbitrary deprivation of liberty. It includes, but is not limited, to the following acts:
- A. "Physical Violence" refers to acts that include bodily or physical harm;
- B. "Sexual Violence" refers to an act which is sexual in nature, committed against a woman or her child. It includes, but is not limited to:
- a) rape, sexual harassment, acts of lasciviousness, treating a woman or her child as a sex object, making demeaning and sexually suggestive remarks, physically attacking the sexual parts of the victim's body, forcing her/him to watch obscene publications and indecent shows or forcing the woman or her child to do indecent acts and/or make films thereof, forcing the wife and mistress/lover to live in the conjugal home or sleep together in the same room and with the abuser:



- b) acts causing or attempting to cause the victim to engage in any sexual activity by force, threat of force, physical or other harm or threat of physical or other harm or coercion;
- c) Prostituting the woman or child:
- C. "Psychological Violence" refers to acts or omissions causing or likely to cause mental or emotional suffering of the victim such as but not limited to intimidation, harassment, stalking, damage to property, public, ridicule or humiliation, repeated verbal abuse and mental infidelity. It includes causing or allowing the victim to witness the physical, sexual or psychological abuse of a member of the family to which the victim belongs, or to witness pornography in any form or to witness abusive injury to pets or to unlawful or unwanted deprivation of the right to custody and/or visitation of common children.
- **D) "Economic abuse"** refers to acts that make or attempt to make a woman financially dependent.

The Cheboygan Housing Commission Administer of Public Housing and the Section 8 Program Landlords may not deny admission to an applicant (male or female) who has been a victim of domestic violence, dating violence or stalking (if the applicant otherwise qualifies for assistance or admission.)

The Cheboygan Housing Commission as owner or the Section 8 Landlords may deny, remove, or terminate assistance to an individual perpetrator of such actions and continue to allow the victim or other household members to remain in the dwelling unit or receive housing assistance.

A Section 8 Housing Voucher Participant who is a victim of domestic violence, dating violence or stalking may request and be granted portability due to the incident.

In processing a request by a victim for continued assistance or for portability, Cheboygan Housing Commission may request that you certify that you are a victim of domestic violence, dating violence or stalking, by presenting certification of the following: (BPO) Barangay Protection Order, (TPO) Temporary Protection Order, (PPO) Permanent Protection Order. The Cheboygan Housing Commission would also accept a letter from a certified Counselor, Psychologist or Preacher. Once this has been proven, Cheboygan Housing Commission can give extra priority points for these victims.
