ATTACHMENT A

Violence Against Women Act

Franklin-Vance-Warren Opportunity, Incorporated operates a Family Resource Center that provides mentoring and counseling for families involved in domestic violence. The Family Resource Center approaches domestic violence from the stand point of prevention. FRC uses a program entitled "Parenting Wisely" which is computer assisted. The "Parenting Wisely" program depicts real life scenarios involving family issues that could lead to domestic violence. The families have group meetings once a week to discuss problems. The families are in charge of these staff- facilitated group sessions. Families are encouraged to engage in healthy dialogue about circumstances that they have encountered. Staff is also available to have private consultations with participants. The staff of FRC is constantly involved in training that will increase their understanding and knowledge of domestic violence issues and causes. This is an excellent resource for the Section 8 residents.
