Notification Methods

Participants:

- The RCHA will provide all participants with notification of their protections and rights under VAWA at the time of admission and at annual re-examination.
- Participants will receive a reminder in a newsletter once a year.
- The notice will explain the protections afforded under the law, inform the participant of RCHA confidentiality requirements, and provide contact information for local victim advocacy groups or service providers.
- The RCHA will also include in all assistance termination notices a statement explaini9ng assistance termination protection provided by VAWA.
- Copy of certification notice will be on lobby bulletin board.

Applicants:

- Applicants will be notified of the VAWA at their briefing.
- The RCHA will provide applicants with information about their protections and rights under VAWA at the time they apply for housing assistance.
- The notices will explain the protections afforded under the law, inform each applicant of the RCHA confidentiality requirements and provide contact information for local victim advocacy groups or service providers.

Owners and Managers

The RCHA will inform property owners and managers of their screening and termination responsibilities related to VAWA. The RCHA may utilize any of the following means to notify owners of their VAWA responsibilities:

- As appropriate in day to day interactions with owners and managers
- Reminder in Newsletter in HAP Payment check at least once a year

Note: The VAWA was discussed with the one person who showed for the Resident Advisory Meeting after sending out over 550 individual invitations. The VAWA was discussed with our Board. No one came to the Public Hearing. The notice about this addendum was posted after the Consolidated Plan Certificate was received.
