

STATEMENTOFPROGRESSINMEETINGTHE5 -YEARPLAN ANDGOALS

PHAGoal:Expandthesupplyofassistedhousing:

TheOceansideHousingAuthoritywasunabletoapplyforadditionalfundingdueto underutilizationofcurrentfundingprimarilyduetopaymentstandardsthatwerenot adequateandaverytightrentalmarketwithlowvacancyratesandrapidlyescalating rents.However,theHousingAuthorityhasbeens uccessfulinincreasingthe utilizationratefortheprogramandshouldbeeligibletoapplyforfundinginthe upcomingfiscalyear.ThevoucherutilizationrateforDecember2001was99%.

PHAGoal:Improvethequalityofassistedhousing

TheOceansideHousingAuthorityhassubmittedtwoSEMAPcertifications, and continuestohavetheobjectiveofbeingrecognizedasahighperformerassoonas possibleandnolaterthanJune30,2005. Asmentionedpreviously, theHousing Authorityhasincreasedthe programutilizationrateto99% asofDecember2001 and therefore is able to assist more households. The waiting time for applicants is approximately one to four years.

Thefocusduring the past six months has been increasing utilization of funding. However, during the next six months the Housing Authority will be focusing on increasing customersatis faction, considering staffing and funding constraints. The Housing Authority senta "customersatis faction" survey to all Section 8 participants in December 2001 and will be evaluating the results to determine additional services that may be provided. Staff has met with housing staff of a local non -profit social service agency, Lifeline, to brain storm ways that we can work together to assist our common clients. In August 2001, Lifeline conducted a Housing Education work shop in the City of Ocean side meeting rooms. All waiting list applicants we renotified of the work shop.

TheOceansideHousingAuthoritycon tinuestoprovidevouchermobilitycounselingat allbriefingsandmoveappointmentsTheHousingAuthorityconductedone informationalmeetingforlandlordsonOctober3,2001, incollaboration with the CommunityOpportunitiesProgram, and the other housing authorities in San Diego County.OneadditionalinformationalmeetingwillbeheldinMarchorApril2002. Thepaymentstandardshavebeenincreasedtwotimesinthecurrentfiscalyear (August1andNovember1,2001)to110% of the HUDFairMarketRen tstoincrease housingchoicestoSection8participants.TheHousingAuthoritywillestablisha programtoassistparticipantstouseitstenant -basedprogramtobecomehomeowners byJune30,2003.AnownernewsletterwasestablishedanddistributedinJuneand December2001.TheHousingAuthorityintendstopublishthenewsletterona quarterlybasis. The Housing Authoritysenta Rental Owner Survey to all Section 8 landlordsinDecember2001 and will develop a marketing planbased on the survey results.New,moreprofessionalownerinformationhasbeendevelopedoverthelast severalmonths.


